Deciphering the STAR Reports Useful Parent Tools



Your child's Star Parent Reports can be requested from your child's teacher. Students are tested 3 – 4 times per year. Below is information to help decipher the results from the reports:

Scaled Score: Raw score

- <u>GE</u>: Grade Level is the Star score as compared to a typical student. For example, 3.2 means your child scored like a third grade 2nd month typical student.
- <u>PR:</u> Percentile rank of your child's performance against other students in the same grade across the US. For example, 95 means your child outscores 95% of students across the US.
- <u>PR Range:</u> Likely range of percentile ranks if your child took the test multiple times.
- NCE Normal Curve Equivalent: -- statistical info used for research
- IRL Instructional Reading Level: Grade/month level your child should be able to read with some instructional assistance. For example, 4.1 means your child is capable of reading and understanding fourth grade 1st month texts.
- <u>ZPD Zone of Proximal Development*:</u> Book reading levels where your child will best improve his/her reading abilities. It ties into the Accelerated Reader book levels (sometimes listed as ATOS or BL).
- * Most books in our library and many in the public library are rated to be a particular reading level. You can look up the ratings for books at www.arbookfind.com. There is also an iPhone app called Point Prober that can read the barcode of a book and report the grade level and points associated with that book.
